




Show students the difference between Alto Clef music blocks and Treble Clef music blocks, and show students how to use them. (Shuffle the nodes to show different numbers.)

Coding Set



Tell students the number on Music blocks represents music notes: Do, Re, Mi, Fa, Sol, La, Ti. Prepare some music note cards.



Give these cards to different students and prepare numbered musical notation cards. The teacher should use piano or softwares to play and sing the music notes, and students whose notes are called need to stand together.

(Examples shown below.)



Ask students to use Music blocks to play the numbered musical notation cards. Students needs to follow MatataBot to sing the notes.






Music Player I



Show the music notes cards to students. If students can sign the song, have them perform it together first.
